## PREFACE - NOTES - INTRODUCTION

The impetus for this Index came from the great pile of notes that had accumulated while rationalising and continuing the work on the Oxford City Morris Men archive volumes. When the pile of notes and odd papers had grown to an unruly mess, the obvious step was to tidy it up to make it easier to use, and at length, present it in a form that would be useful to others.

Having never before considered the skills and decisions necessary for the compilation of an index and being completely inexperienced in the art, what follows bears the marks of someone learning on the job. Decisions about what should be included or omitted were developed and stabilised during the course of a single read through, and only a small amount of back-tracking was done to rectify glaring inconsistencies in the entries.

Apart from one or two exceptions, no pub names appear in the index. Instead I have tried to include the names of all the dance locations visited by the Oxford (City) Morris Men, O(C)MM. All of the local villages stands are included, but venues within Oxford are left out in a slightly erratic way. For example, events in Binsey, Marston, Summertown, and Iffley are in, but those in the City (too many), Osney and at The Plain are not. However, all references to St. Giles' Fair and Little Clarendon Street Fair are indexed. Places visited while participating in Ring Meetings are indexed. Also tours away from the area are included but not the individual venues they include.

One lesson that may be learned from all this is the problem associated with the use of first names by logkeepers. My own logkeeping has fallen into the same trap. It is easy to write a log to be read by those in the know, but when no surnames appear anywhere in a single piece of work, great difficulty is encountered when the document is ten or more years old. Who was Bob? Who were 'the six Petes' and of course in 20 years of association with Bonn, how many members of The Brückenberger Trachtengruppe were called Hans? Of course, it is likely that many of the Brückenberger's surnames were unknown to the logkeepers, but that has not helped me solve how many people are involved in the four possible different Michaels.

I hope this small document does for you what it has done for me. It has not only proved to be an invaluable reference, but a way of bringing the whole fifteen volume set to life: instead of presenting a three foot long row of daunting black spines.

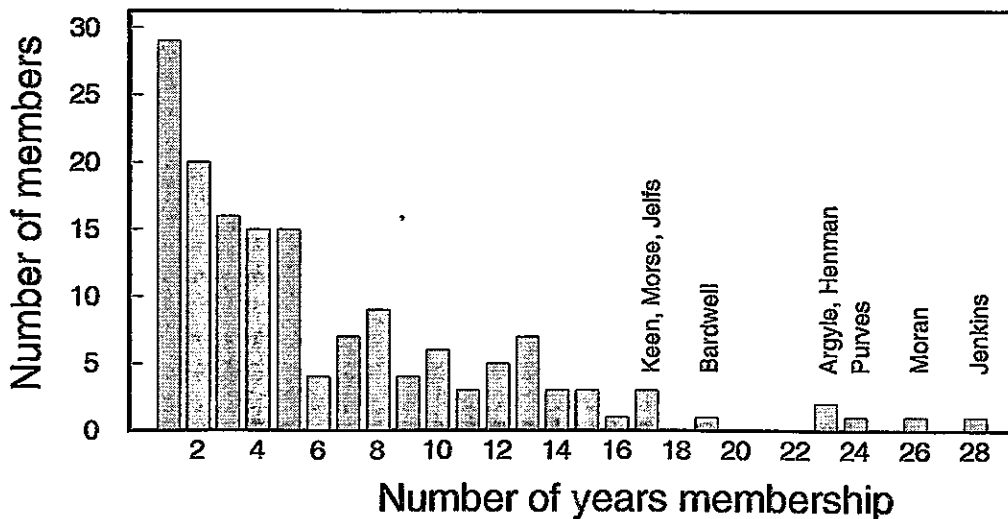
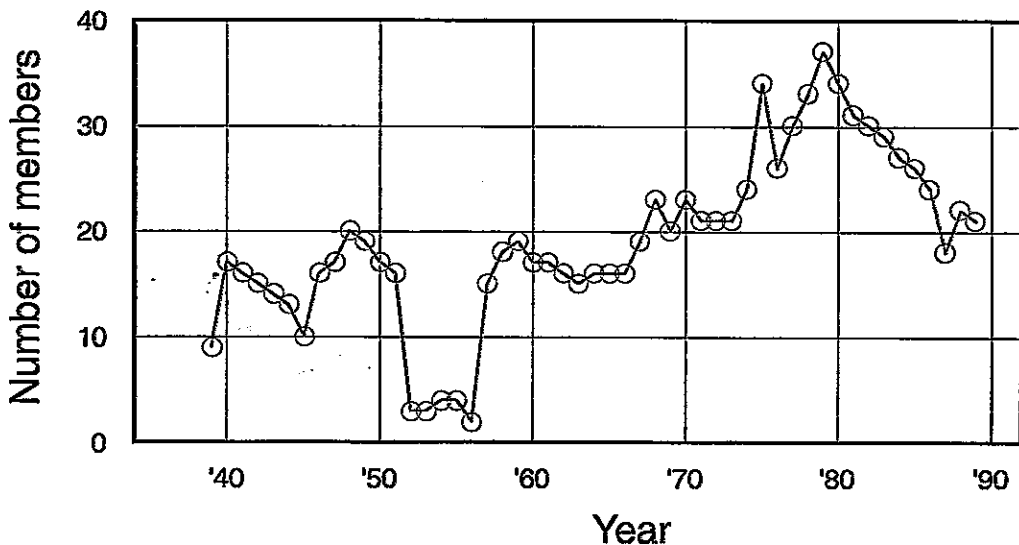

MEMBERS 1938-1989

The following list of members needs some explanation for two principal reasons, (1) the need for a subjective definition of 'a member' and, (2) it is based solely upon the occurrence of peoples names in the archive. Therefore, the number of years given as the time a person spent in connection with O(C)MM will be an under-estimate unless their arrival and departure are explicitly stated. Also before the 1958 revival and the introduction of subscriptions, membership was only loosely defined, and many people turned up from other clubs (Oxford University, Headington Quarry, Abingdon Traditional and the EFDSS): partly through committed support for O(C)MM and partly because their own sides may have been at a low ebb at the time.

Before 1957 my definition of membership ranges from the fully committed, to those men and women who danced, played, instructed, and were committed to maintain the Oxford Morris Men even though they may have had stronger allegiances as mentioned above. The definition after 1957 is more clear: those paying subs, appearing in City kit or appearing as a regular musician.

All members whose association continues beyond 1989 are indicated with '>', but the years of membership are only calculated up to 1989.
